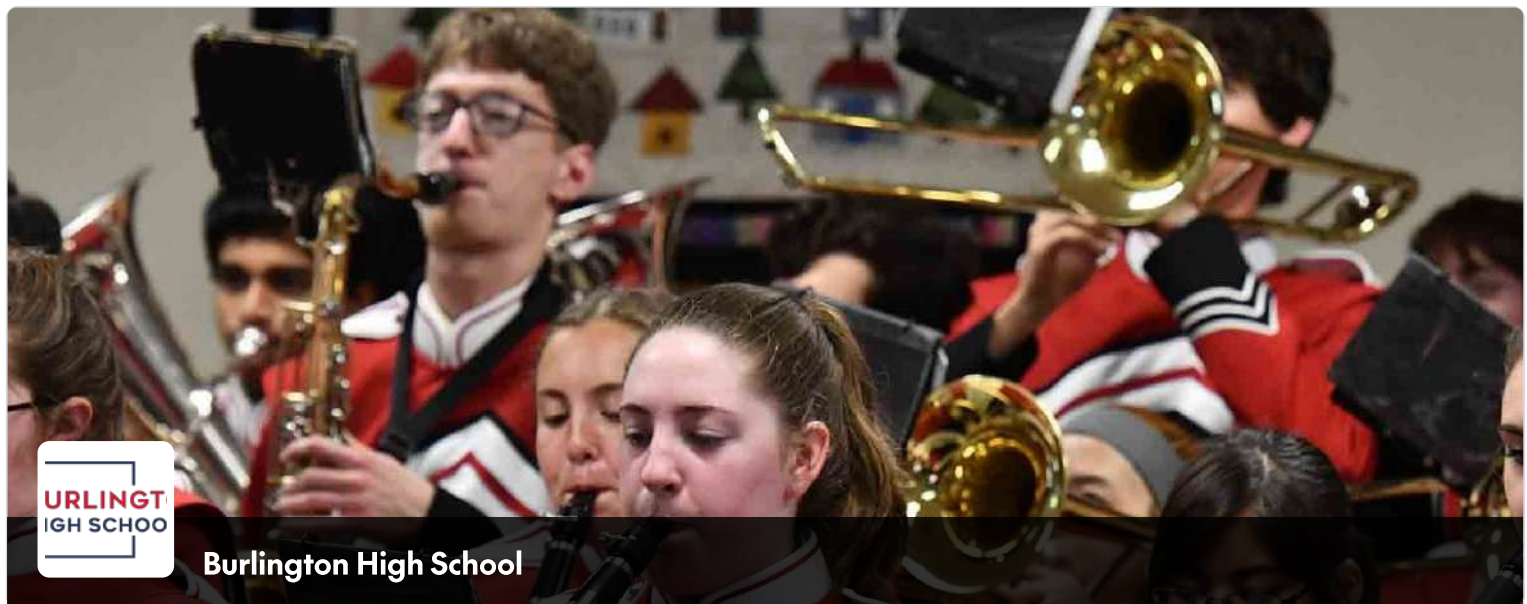

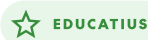

BHS is consistently ranked among the top 20% of public high schools in Massachusetts. The school's commitment to academic excellence is reflected in its state test results, where 67% of students are proficient in reading, and 57% in math—outperforming state averages. A proud member of the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, BHS is driven by a mission to prepare students for lifelong learning and responsible citizenship.

Facilities

The BHS campus boasts modern facilities designed to enhance both learning and extracurricular activities. Students have access to well-equipped classrooms, state-of-the-art science labs, an extensive library, and a full-service cafeteria. The campus also features athletic fields, a gymnasium, and performing arts spaces that support the school's vibrant sports and arts programs.

As a member of the Middlesex League, Burlington High School has a storied tradition in athletics, excelling in sports such as football, hockey, and gymnastics.
