The school's large auditorium hosts performances, assemblies, and community events, while two courtyards offer quiet spaces for reflection and relaxation. The auxiliary gym and additional art studios also ensure that students can explore a wide range of extracurricular activities, from athletics to the arts.

Coventry High School is home to the Patriots, a proud member of the North Central Connecticut Conference (NCCC). The school offers 16 varsity sports, including soccer, volleyball, basketball, baseball, softball, cross country, and track and field. In recent years, the boys' baseball team won the CIAC State Championship in 2019, and the girls' volleyball team captured the state title in 2017, showcasing the school's competitive edge. Coventry also excels in the arts, with its award-winning band, choir, and visual arts programs. Students frequently perform in concerts, participate in art exhibitions, and are encouraged to develop their creative talents.
